Director's Notes

I had been looking for a short film to direct for almost a year. I had looked at many possible projects before "The Platform" came my way. It's not often you ready a short film script and immediately fall in love with it. It was such a simple idea with a classic three-act structure and a quirky twist at the end. I especially liked the idea of the story being cyclic.

Casting was easy; I had worked with Peter Feeney previously and knew he was ideal for the lead. A week before the shoot Peter and I went to the location, walked it through, shot it on video and edited it the following day on *imovie*. This proved invaluable on the shoot day where everything an exceptionally smooth. This was also due to the experience and dedication of my producer Jack Sainte-Rose. Thanks Jack.

Director's Biography

Robin Walters has been directing television commercials for the last 10 years in London, Europe and more recently in his native New Zealand. Earlier this year he took time out from advertising to concentrate on projects longer than 30 seconds and directed his first drama, a 30 min contemporary Maori mythological ghost story, 'Sisters' which is part of the Mataku series to be screened in New Zealand and shortly at the Hawaiian Film Festival. After the drama Robin went straight on to direct his first short film entitled 'The Platform'

Producer's Biography

Jack Sainte-Rose has some 14 years experience in the production of films, documentaries, television programmes, drama s and commercials. The majority of her experience (some 10 years) was gained in the U.K. Jack started out in production working for one of the U.K.'s most respected drama and factual programming film companies, Wall to Wall Television then co-owned by Jane Root (now Controller of the highly acclaimed channel - BBC 2) and Alex Graham, Jack worked as Jane Root's assistant for some 5 years. Jack then went on to work for the Film and Drama department of the BBC for 2 years. Her role at the BBC was to work closely with Michael Wearing and Michael Brent who produced programmes such as EastEnders, Pie in the Sky, Brighton Boy to name a few. Whilst she was at the BBC Jack met with Film Producer Ann Wingate (Prick up Your Ears, Room with a View, Wings of a Dove, Portrait of a Lady) who she left the BBC to work with on feature films. Whilst working as Assistant Producer with Ann Wingate on Portriat of a Lady directed by Jane Champion, Jack met with New Zealand Gaffer Sean O'Neill and left the UK to live and work in New Zealand. On arriving in NZ Jack went on to work with Fane Flaws and Jeff Williams running their Auckland Production Company, FAT (aka Black Stump Film Company) where she met and produced for Robin Walters. Jack now has her own Production Company, Orbital Film.
